Grenada, Carriacou, & Petite Martinique **The Spice of the Caribbean**

Discover a destination, so picturesque and pure, where un-spoilt natural beauty accentuates the friendly smiles of a people content with the simpler things in life. It's a place where turquoise waters kiss pristine white and black sand beaches; and a quick drive inland reveals a plethora of waterfalls, hot springs, and playful Mona Monkeys nestled in a tropical rainforest. This is Grenada, Carriacou, and Petite Martinique – the Spice of the Caribbean.

Located in the Southern Caribbean, Southwest of Barbados, and outside the hurricane belt, Grenada, Carriacou, and Petite Martinique offer a safe and friendly, year-round, tropical escape.

Stamped the Caribbean's prettiest place by the Huffington Post, this diverse nation offers three unique islands, all in one captivatingly authentic destination.

With a riveting history, Grenada (Gree-Nay-Dah) retains a colonial charm that's not only evident in the vibrant culture and traditions of its people, but in the eighteenth century Georgian architecture that still defines its capital city, St. George's. Internationally, the island is known as the Isle of Spice, an accolade fittingly ascribed as the country produces the most spices per square mile – predominantly nutmeg and cinnamon. Our spices are complemented by our production of fine organic cocoa and exquisite world famous chocolate.



Measuring just 133 square miles, with only 110,000 people, Grenada's lush terrain is not saturated with towering structures, and signs of over-commercialisation. Instead, its landscapes are populated with laden fruit and spice trees, wild tropical gardens, over 164 species of tropical birds, and scenic trails that not only beckon, but captivate discerning travellers – most times converting them into repeat visitors.

In Grenada, life is **PURE** – Peaceful, Unadulterated, Rejuvenating and Easy-going. It is effortless, yet engaging; celebratory, yet stoic. In Grenada, communities still raise children, people are friendly by nature and common courtesy is not for gain – it's a way of life!



Carriacou

Just 90 minutes by ferry, or 20 minutes by plane from the mainland Grenada, is the destination's second largest island, Carriacou (Karry-a-cou) which means "Isle of Reefs". Measuring just 13 square miles, with a population of 8,000, the tiny island is known as an excellent dive and snorkel destination with pristine coral reefs and magical drifts. It also has the distinction of being the largest Grenadine island.

Carriacou boasts a dynamic culture, steeped in ancestral traditions – all of which reflect the rich African and Scottish ancestry of its inhabitants. Even today, African big drum nation dance and European quadrille are common staples at celebrations and festivals.

For centuries, 'Kayaks', as they are commonly called, have passed down through generations, the boatbuilding traditions of their Scottish forefathers. Today, large sloops and schooners are still being built in the traditional methods once plied by ancestors in the village of Windward. These boats are the feature of the island's premier Regatta Festival (August), the longest running in the Caribbean.

The island boasts a slew of other historic traditions; such as Saraca, Tombstone Feasts, Parang Festival, Maroon & String Band Music Festival, and Shakespeare Mas (as seen in photo on left) - the reenactment of plays by William Shakespeare during its pre-lenten carnival celebrations.



Petite Martinique

This 586-acre island which completes the tri-island destination is situated east, off the northern half of Carriacou. About 900 persons live on the island, most of whom derive their income from boat building and fishing. Petite Martinique (Pitty-Mar-Ti-Neek) has a strong culture and rich history manifested through its traditions and festivals. The highest point on the island, the Piton (750 feet high) was once the site of the island's maroon feast also known as the 'Sugaring of the Piton'. Signature festivals on this island include the cultural Petite Martinique Heritage Weekend and the Whitsuntide Regatta.

Petite Martinique is also blessed with fine beaches on the calmer Western Leeward side. Like Carriacou, the French first settled Petite Martinique, which is evident to this day in the names of the islanders. The only option to get to Petite Martinique is via boat.





Serene Escapes

In Pure Grenada, peace, calm and tranquillity surround you. With our warm climate, relaxed lifestyle, and hospitable people, you will always feel at ease, and our life motto of “nothing is ever too much trouble” will naturally infuse into yours. With our advantageous size and topography, you can escape to the beach and perch on top of one of our many breath-taking sites taking in the picturesque scenery, all within moments. Whether you choose to meditate beside Grand Etang Lake or absorb a fiery sunset along the coastline, you’re guaranteed to fall into complete bliss.

Beaches

Together, the islands of Grenada, Carriacou, and Petite Martinique boast over 40 pristine white sand beaches – all offering great opportunities for swimming, sunbathing, and snorkeling. Beach sports, particularly friendly games of football, cricket, or volleyball, are favourite pastimes of locals, and are usually visible on weekends and holidays. Kayaking, paddle boarding and other water activities are readily available for added pleasure on some of the island’s most popular beaches. Whatever the use, Grenada’s beaches present the perfect escape for some much needed fun in the sun.





Grand Anse Beach

This two-mile stretch of white sand is by far Grenada's most acclaimed beach. Home to some of the island's finest hotels and punctuated with sea grape, almond and palm trees, this iconic beach is not only easily accessible, but serves up amazing beach bars, water sports, and a thrifty arts and crafts market.



La Sagesse Beach

Located on Grenada's east coast, this secluded grey and white sand beach provides the perfect hideaway for vacationers. Once ranked 3rd among the 10 most Tropical Beaches by the Sunday Times, it is home to the La Sagesse boutique hotel with tropical gardens.



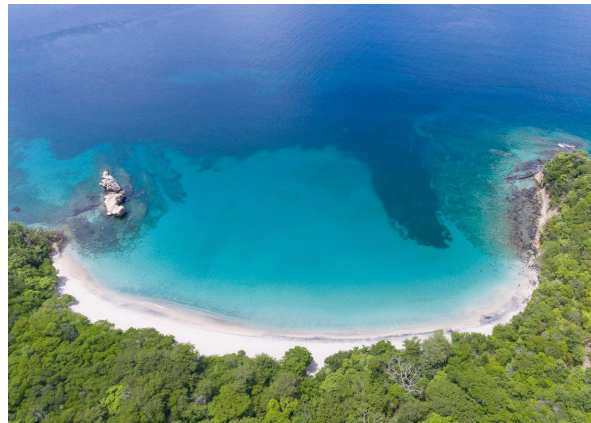
Levera Beach

Sitting at the north-eastern tip of Grenada, the breathtaking view of the northern islands extends as far as Carriacou on a clear day. This exclusive stretch of white sand emits a sense of timelessness and provides a safe haven for female leatherback turtles to lay their eggs.



Morne Rouge Bay

This amazingly calm bay is known for its shallow crystal clear waters and air of seclusion. Popularly known as BBC Beach, its 400 yards of white sand is a favoured stop for boat-rides and paddle boarding.



Anse La Roche Beach (Carriacou)

Known for its feature in the Pirates of the Caribbean film, this sheltered beach boasts beautiful coral reefs just offshore. Secluded and accessible from land by a half-mile hike, at the foot of the famous High North Range, the beach is secluded and unspoilt.



Paradise Beach (Carriacou)

This pristine, unspoilt beach goes by the perfect name – Paradise. Its calm, turquoise waters are perfect for swimming or relaxing on lazy days. With views of Sandy Island and Carriacou's lush green hills from its shaded shores, it is the ideal haven for the leisure traveller.



ECO Sites

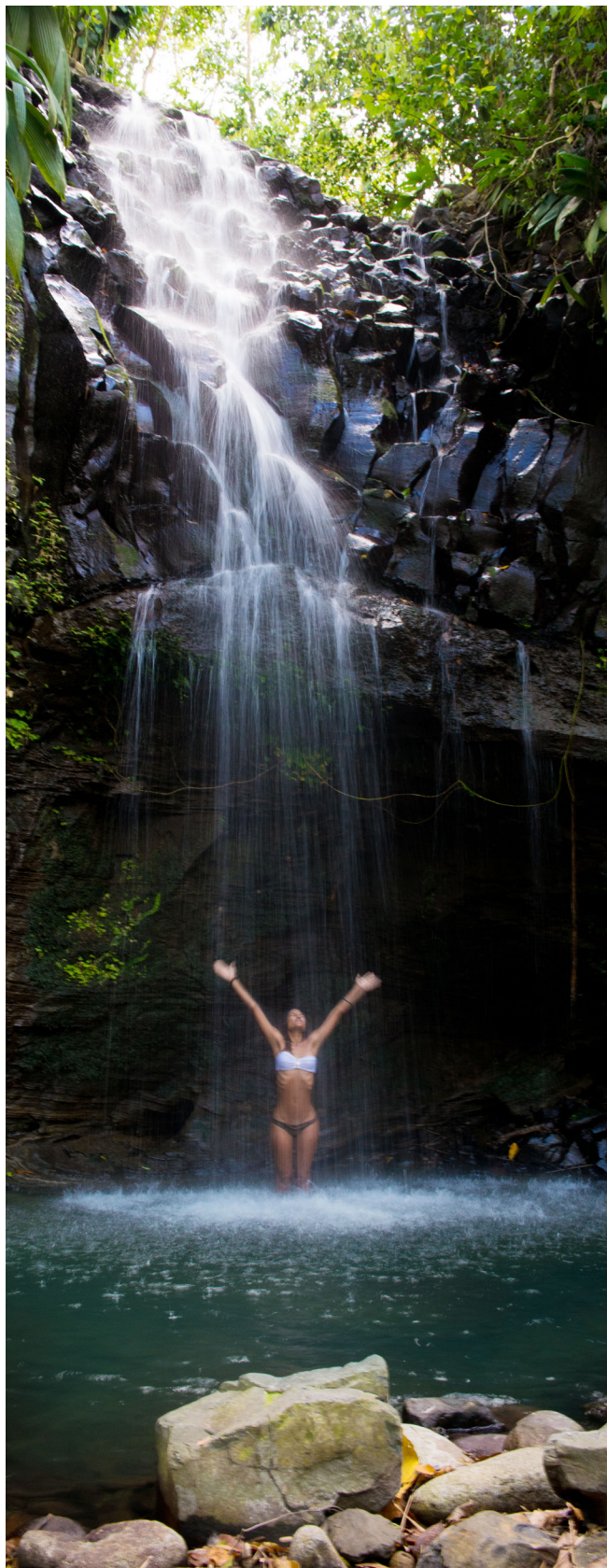
One-ninth of Grenada's landmass is preserved as parks and natural wildlife sanctuaries. Luscious, bountiful tropical forests, filled with a wide variety of flora and fauna, allow visitors to interact with wildlife in their natural habitat, while basking in the unadulterated splendour of nature. Trek through rainforests, which uncover the most magical waterfalls; and, if you're brave enough, endeavour to stand at the mouth of a dormant volcano.

Levera National Park

The 450-acre Levera National Park holds a strong reputation as Grenada's most scenic and spectacular coastal area. Its lagoon, consisting of an extensive mangrove swamp, is one of the most important wildlife habitats on the island, and is home to exotic bird species, such as herons, black-necked stilts among others. Levera's marine areas are equally esteemed, with outstanding coral reefs and sea grass beds that shelter lobster and beautiful reef fish.

Levera Turtle Watching

Within Levera National Park lies Levera Beach, home of leatherback turtles which surface ashore from as far as Ireland and West Africa, between March and August to lay their eggs. These enormous but beautiful creatures are critically endangered with only 1 in every 1000 hatchlings surviving to adulthood. It is a captivating sight following the turtles from the sea, watching them dig their 70cm deep nests in the sand, laying their eggs, and finally witnessing the hatchlings emerge from their eggs and find their way into the sea. Grand Etang Lake

The crater of an extinct volcano, this 30-acre lake, buried within the Grand Etang Forest Reserve, sits approximately 1,740 ft above sea level. Its calming serenity makes it a popular spot for family picnics, meditation and yoga retreats.

Grand Etang Forest Reserve

The most popular area in Grenada for hiking and trekking is undoubtedly the rainforest around the Grand Etang Forest Reserve. Grand Etang's varied elevations and terrain maintain several ecological subsystems, culminating in the elfin woodlands of the reserve's central mountains. Its flora includes towering mahogany and giant gommier trees, as well as a multitude of ferns, tropical flowers and other indigenous plants. The lush vegetation provides shelter for a wide variety of animals, particularly for the island's many species of birds. It is also the only home, outside of West Africa, to the ever-playful Mona Monkey.

Waterfalls

Grenada's lush interior is blessed with cascading waterfalls, plunging into refreshing pools - perfect for quick dips and swims. Relatively untouched, and under-commercialised, most of these picturesque landmarks are nestled in Grenada's rainforests, requiring a short hike or trek by nature lovers. Cook-ups and 'limes' – the local lingo for the action of hanging out, are a mainstay of locals at these scenic spots, especially on holidays.

Sulphur Springs

Grenada is home to a number of sulphur springs each with its own special character. They are noted not only for their unique geology with complimentary flora and fauna but also for their health and wellness benefits. A soothing bath in the spring complimented with an invigorating scrub of sulphur on the skin will leave you feeling relaxed, refreshed, and renewed.



Lake Antoine

This shallow crater lake, like Grand Etang, is host to a wide variety of wildlife. The lake's perimeter trail, a beautiful walk in itself, is another of Grenada's excellent attractions for bird-watchers. Among the species frequently sighted are the snail kite, the fulvous whistling duck, large billed seed-finch, gray kingbird and limpkin.

Hiking

Qua Qua to Fedon's Camp, the base of operations for Grenada's famous Julien Fedon, who led a rebellion against British rule in 1795. There are trails that cater to every level of fitness and adventure and beauty await around any corner.

Off-Roading

Dune buggies provide entertainment for the thrill seekers as they are able to truly enjoy the island's beauty in fun, comfortable and easy to manoeuvre buggies, 'off roading' into parts of the island not typically seen when using other modes of transportation.

Paddle Boarding/Kayaking

Grenada's calm waters make these easy-going water sports a true joy to experience. Choose your own board/kayak to enjoy our beautiful Grand Anse coastline or explore our inlets, coves and mangroves.

River Tubing & Jeep Tours

Adventurous visitors can experience the "thrill of a lifetime" tubing through the rapids of Balthazar River, spinning and swirling in a modified river tube. View the exotic scenery of the tropical vegetation on your way down. You can also jump on a safari jeep to tour the island's famous spots such as the rainforest and sulphur springs.

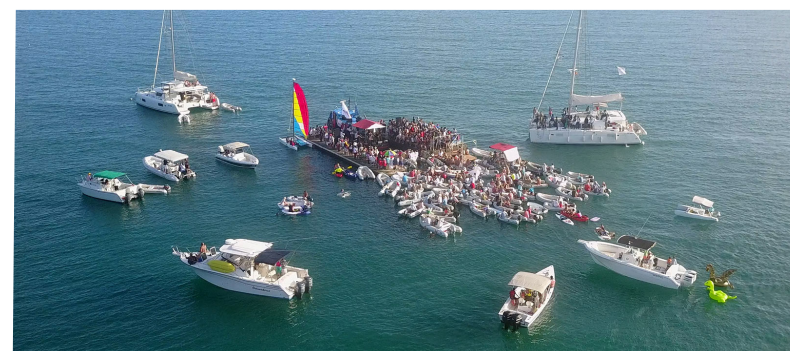
Gateway to the Grenadines

Southernmost of the Grenadine islands, Grenada's pristine waters offer the best sailing in the Caribbean. As such, the tri-island nation is considered one of the premier yachting centres in the region. Whether on your own boat, on a crewed yacht, or even a bare boat rental, Grenada is an excellent base from which to explore the Grenadines.

The country is blessed with numerous bays and inlets for sheltered anchoring. There are ten great marinas, from rural low-key tranquillity, to

top class super yacht facilities. The boatyards are recognised worldwide for safe yacht storage and high-class refit and maintenance work. Chandlery and technical yacht services are also available at all marine locations.

Top quality regattas are a common feature throughout the year. The most popular by far are Grenada Sailing Week, and the Carriacou Regatta. Whether they are super fast yachts or workboats steeped in tradition, seeing them battle for the finish line, whilst enjoying the festive atmosphere and activities that go hand-in-hand with the regattas, is nothing short of exciting.



Dinghy Music Concerts

Everyone loves a good music concert. How about rocking to the music of popular bands while perched in the middle of the ocean? In Grenada, we've added our own twist to the vibe of a musical concert. Out of this World

When visiting the islands of Grenada & Carriacou for Diving you will be enchanted by the amazing marine bio-diversity that these 'Sister Islands' have to offer. We are blessed with endless coral reefs, awesome shipwrecks, and the unique Underwater Sculpture Park – all within short distances from the shore. In fact, with over 50 dive sites to keep you entertained during your visit, there will always be something special waiting for you.

Wreck Dives for All Divers

Diving in Grenada & Carriacou offers something for all types of divers. The islands enjoy an abundance of healthy coral reefs with a diversity of marine life that amazes even seasoned divers. Furthermore, wreck diving opportunities are unsurpassed. Between the two islands, there are 15 wrecks suitable to all levels of divers. These range from shallow water wrecks for vacation and novice divers, to massive wrecks, like the famous Italian cruise liner the Bianca C – known as the Titanic of the Caribbean. The 160-meter vessel, which sank in 1961, offers an awesome experience for the advanced diver. 'Twin Tugs' in Carriacou, is yet another fantastic addition to the collection. The wrecks at both destinations are home to a wide range of corals, sponges, fish, and other fascinating marine life that have adopted these artificial reefs as their homes.



Dive Sites Within Reach

If you are visiting with non-diving partners, no worries. All the dive shops are situated at the waterside within easy reach of all the dive sites. You can happily enjoy a morning's dive knowing that you can be back by lunchtime to rejoin your partner for an afternoon of relaxation, swimming, sightseeing, or perhaps accompany your partner on a snorkeling trip at the ideally suited reefs in Grenada & Carriacou's Marine Protected Areas.



Become PADI Certified

If you have never dived before, this is your perfect opportunity. The warm, calm waters of Grenada are ideal for your first underwater adventure. All Grenada Dive Operators offer a 'Discover Scuba Diving Course' (Resort Course). In only half a day, under professional supervision, you can experience fantastic underwater treasures! If you are 'hooked' by the experience, you can easily become a qualified Diver. All dive centers offer the internationally recognized PADI Open Water Course. Just ask for further details at your dive center of choice.

Underwater Sculpture Park

If you are looking for something special and just a bit different, come and explore Grenada's spectacular Underwater Sculpture Park nestled within the Molinere/Beausejour Marine Protected Area. The first of its kind in the world, the park is home to 14 unique sculpture installations that perfectly encapsulate Pure Grenada's colourful history, culture and folklore. The art installations include a mermaid, the Christ of the Deep, the Nutmeg Princess and Vicissitudes more popularly called the 'Ring of Children'. Come see our recent interactive installation; the selfie statue. Sit beside her on a bench and take your own selfie. The work of renowned English sculptor Jason deCaires Taylor, these statues have become a haven for marine life, therefore easing the environmental pressure on other reefs in the area. The sculptures have brought a quirky, but memorable dimension to diving, kayaking and snorkelling in Grenada. If you don't want to get wet, booking a sailing trip aboard a glass bottom boat offers a great way to experience the artistry in the park.

However, you define love and whatever your desires, Pure Grenada, Carriacou and Petite Martinique make your wedding day an easy enjoyable experience with zero residency and 24 hour marriage licenses. The destination offers a diverse mix of resorts and hotels, which provide enticing wedding and honeymoon packages catering to every taste. So whether you wish to have your wedding at one of our over 40 pristine white sandy beaches, beneath our turquoise waters or at one of our signature gardens or historic estates, the choice is yours.

Couples must submit an application (in English) to the Registrar General then to the Cabinet Office in the Prime Minister's Ministry (Ministerial Complex, Botanical Gardens, St. George's) to receive their license within 24 hours (once all documentation has been verified). A marriage license (24 hours) will cost USD \$200.

The application shall be made in writing and signed by one of the parties to the intended marriage and shall state the full name and address, the age, occupation and status of both parties.

The following documents must be presented when applying for a license:

- Valid passport
- Birth certificate
- Divorce papers, if applicable
- Affidavit signed by a minister of religion, lawyer or justice of the peace verifying that there are no impediments to the wedding
- Death certificate if widowed
- Legal proof if name is changed by Deed Poll
- Affidavit providing parental consent if the parties are under 18

There is also the option of obtaining a special marriage license through an agent. An application must be submitted through the agent 30 days prior to the wedding date on island. This option carries zero residency as well.

All weddings on island must happen between 6am and 6pm.



Popular Attractions

Belair National Park

This park has old French and English ruins along with pristine windmills that attest to Carriacou's industrial past. It is also the venue for the Carriacou Maroon and String Band Music Festival and the Heritage Village.

Belmont Estate

Spread across 400 acres of lush rolling hills in the north of Grenada, this 300 year old working plantation is the Caribbean's finest Agro-tourism experience. The estate offers hands-on plantation and cocoa tours, including tastings of Grenada's highly acclaimed organic dark chocolate at its onsite factory. It's also hailed for its authentic cuisine, goat dairy farm and beautiful gardens.

Forts

Established in the late 16th and early 17th centuries, Forts George, Matthew and Frederick boast spectacular panoramic views of St. George's, enhanced with rich history. Fort George acted as the centre stage for the tumultuous political upheavals in the 1983 Revolution on the island.

Gouyave Nutmeg Processing Station

The Gouyave Nutmeg Processing Station is one of the largest nutmeg processing factories on the island. Visitors can see the workers choose, grade, and package the nutmegs. You can also step into the stencil room and get a local jute bag customized with any words of your choice. At the end of your tour, explore 'Nutmeg World' for packaged spices, clothing and other locally made tokens to remember your spice tour in Pure Grenada.

House of Chocolate

This quaint museum is exploding with vibrant colours, captivating scents, and of course...delicious chocolate! Apart from learning about the 'bean to bar' production of chocolate, you can sit and relax in the café to savour delectable chocolate inspired bites and beverages.

Petroglyphs

These well-carved images embedded into rocks are from the Amerindian era around 1,000 AD and can be found at several points in the western and northern coasts of the island such as in Mt. Rich and Duquesne.

River Antoine Estate

This privately owned rum distillery dates back to 1785 and is home to the oldest functioning water-propelled distillery in the western hemisphere. It uses traditional methods to produce its white rums. At River Antoine, visitors are given the opportunity to witness the rum production process and taste their wide selection of rums.

Welcome Stone

Visit one of the most picturesque spots in Pure Grenada. Welcome Stone is located in the northern parish of St. Patrick's and offers spectacular views of the Levera National Park. Breathe in the fresh clean mountain air as you relax in this tranquil area overlooking the lush scenery and large lake below. A trip to Welcome Stone is not complete without taking an awesome selfie for your social media.



Pure Grenada Music Festival

Grenada's premiere musical festival features a perfect mix of world music and local island music. Celebrated genres include soul, reggae, jazz, rhythm and blues and soca. The Pure Grenada Music Festival is spread over a few days with so much to enjoy. The beat never drops with a main and secondary stage, as well as a food village offering a diverse variety of options for local cuisine. The organizers are also committed to making the events as 'green' as possible, establishing receptacles for separating recyclables from trash and ensuring vendors use biodegradable food containers and utensils. The associated non-profit organization, Music and Beyond, is committed to building a legacy for the development of talent in Grenada by providing an opportunity for local artists to share their gifts.

Performers whom have graced the festival stage include Tarrus Riley (Jamaica), Steel Pulse (UK), Third World (Jamaica), Joss Stone (UK), Estelle (US), Chrisette Michelle (USA) and Queen Ifrica (Jamaica). Ensure that you don't miss out on who will rock the stage next.

Spicemas Carnival & Kayak Mas

Spicemas is the Caribbean's final summer carnival, famous for its pulsating conch shell rhythms, and its traditional mas – particularly its Jab Jab. The festival is the ultimate celebration of Grenadian culture, climaxing during the second Monday and Tuesday in August. The islanders add their own flavor to the festivities while exhibiting their unique traditions. One such tradition is Shakespeare Mas in which masqueraders dressed in colorful costumes recite Shakespeare's best lines in friendly duels.

All visitors must obtain a temporary driver's license before they are allowed to drive in Grenada. This can be obtained from the Traffic Department located on the Carenage, St. George's, at a fee of XCD\$60. It can also be obtained through the car rental company. Remember, driving is on the left hand side of the road. Be safe now!

Mini Bus

Local transportation is available throughout Grenada, Carriacou & Petite Martinique. Zone stickers are conveniently placed at the front of each bus to guide you to your destination. There is always a conductor managing the passengers, who will be able to help, should you need assistance. Bus fares range from XCD \$2.50 to XCD \$6.50 depending on your desired route. Please note that public transportation to and from Maurice Bishop International Airport is by request only and requires additional fees.

Getting to Grenada

Grenada is served by international airlines and cruise companies from North and South America, Europe and the Caribbean. International flights stop at Maurice Bishop International Airport, and visitors wishing to continue on to the sister isle of Carriacou can take a short inter-island flight to Lauriston Airport, or a ferry which also connects to Petite Martinique.

A valid passport and return ticket is required for all visitors traveling to Grenada. British, Canadian, and American citizens may also enter with any proof of citizenship bearing a photograph. It must be noted, however that the United States Department of Homeland Security mandates all US travellers to provide a valid passport to enter or re-enter the USA following vacation or business travel. A visa is not required for citizens from the USA, Canada, the UK, and most European countries, the British Commonwealth, South Korea, China, Japan, and most Caribbean countries.

Travelling with Animals

Visiting the islands of Grenada, Carriacou, and Petite Martinique, isn't just fun for humans, it's also great for animals! Travelling with your favourite companion is a simple process.

Visitors must submit a formal request for a permit to the Government Veterinary Officer at the Ministry of Agriculture. This can be done via email at agriculture@gov.gd.

The formal permit request must include the age, sex, colour, and breed of the animal; as well as the expected port of entry, the airline, date and time of arrival.

Upon receipt of the formal request, the Ministry of Agriculture will fax or email the import permit requested. When the visitor arrives in Grenada, he/she must present the import permit to the Customs Division at the port of entry. This must be accompanied by:

- Vaccination documentation – proof that the animal has been vaccinated against Rabies, Distemper, Hepatitis, Leptospirosis, and Parvovirus, and pare Influenza within the last 12 months.
- Veterinary certificate of health, not older than two weeks old.

A one-time charge of 67.9 percent of the animal's cost price must also be paid to the Customs Department at the port of entry. Visitors are encouraged to retain their receipts to avoid paying future charges for the same animal. If an applicant wishes, he/she may wish to have an agent collect the import permit on his/her behalf in Grenada and deliver it to the port of entry upon arrival.
